



Kidding around with illegal fireworks can be dangerous for kids.

Illegal fireworks aren't just illegal in Chino – they're risky. Playing with them could cost a child or you serious burns to the head, face, hands, and body. They could also cost you a \$1,000 fine for using or possessing them.

And if they set a fire or cause property damage, you'll pay even more.



They can also cause serious injury to pets. Dogs, cats, and horses get scared by fireworks, causing them to panic and escape, get lost, wind up at animal shelters or even run into the street resulting in motor vehicle accidents and injuries.

So, be smart on the 4th of July – don't kid around with fireworks.

Why take the chance? Why pay the price?

The City of Chino will strictly enforce fireworks laws and fines:
Possession or use of illegal fireworks – **\$1,000 fine.**
Inappropriate use of safe and sane fireworks – **\$500 fine.**
No fireworks allowed anywhere outside a residential zone; in any public park; in the area bounded by Euclid Avenue to the west, Kimball Avenue to the south, and the city limits to the north and east; and in the area south of Pine Avenue to the city limits.
