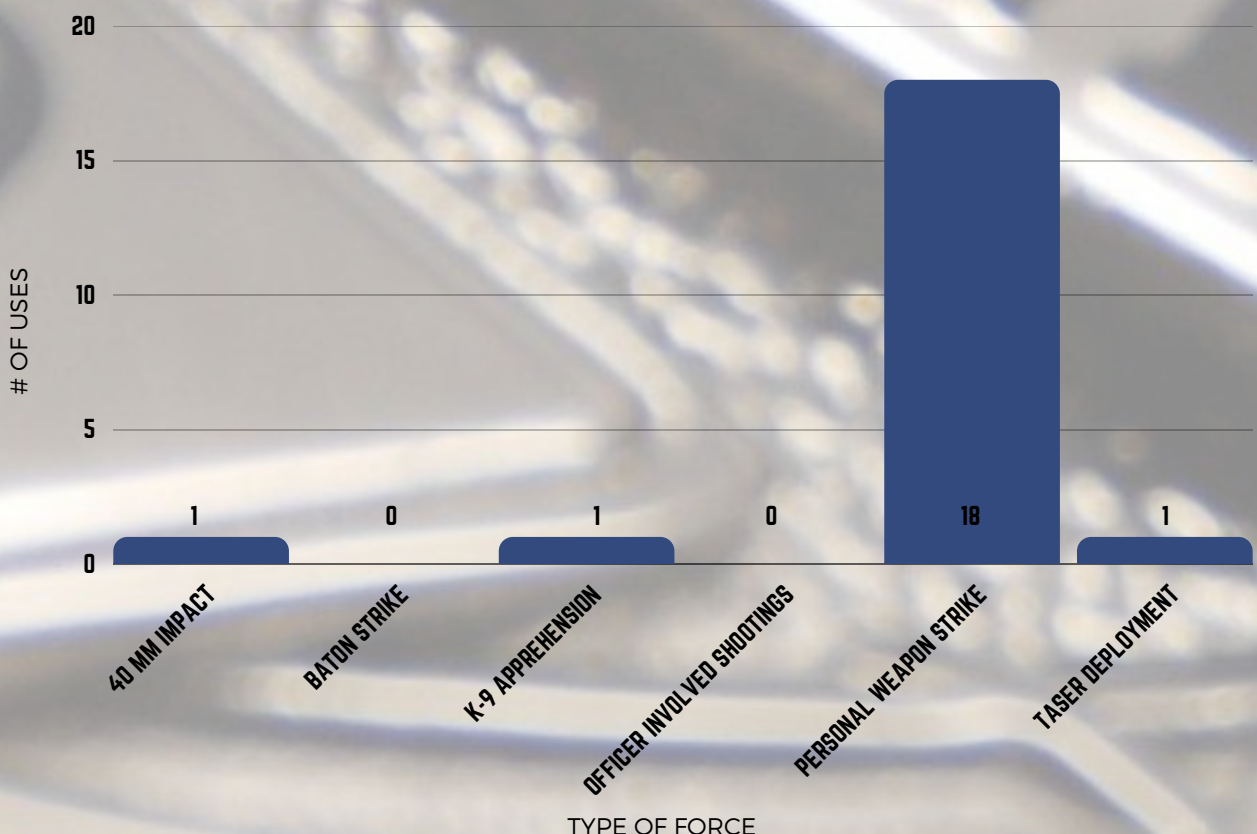




PROFESSIONAL STANDARDS

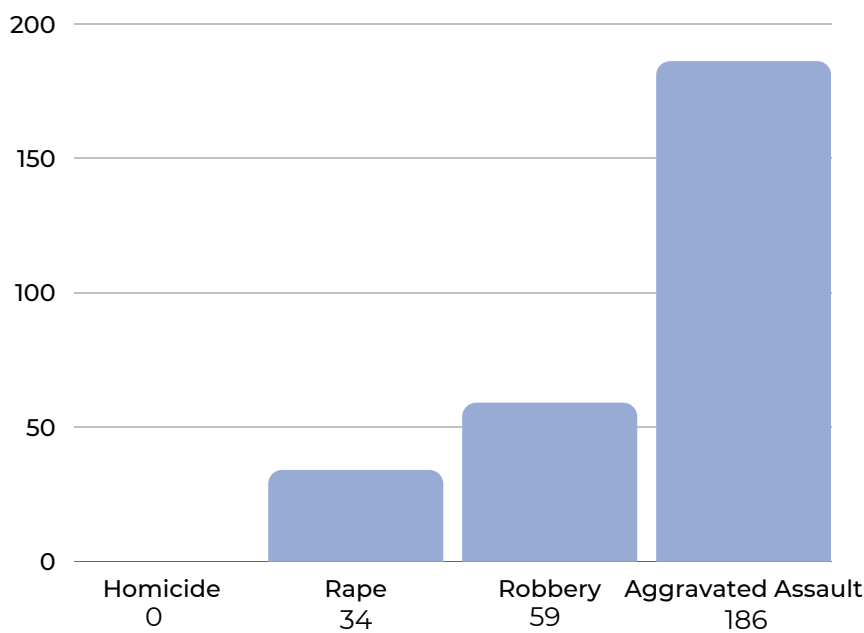
Of the 97,979 calls for service, which included 3,283 arrests, Chino Police Officers had to use force 21 times. That equates to .02% of the total number of calls for service.

The department implemented SPIDR Tech in February of 2022 to improve communication between the department and our community. With this implementation, the department received 85 formal citizen compliments for exemplary service provided by officers and professional staff. Through SPIDR, 2,800 customer satisfaction surveys were sent out. The overall satisfaction rating for the year was 96%.

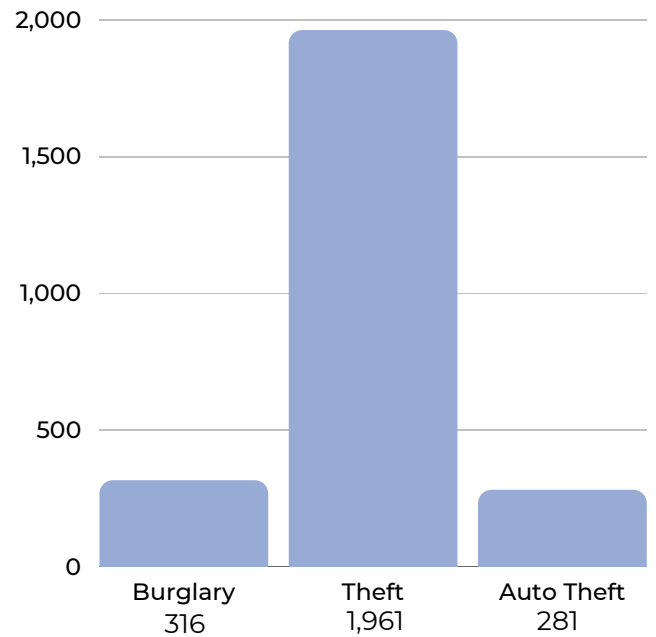


DISRUPTING CRIME

The Real-Time Crime Center is staffed with two full-time Analysts. The Crime Analysts assist field personnel with information sharing, technology monitoring, risk and safety information, and investigative assistance for both in-progress and historical crimes.

PATROL BUREAU

THE PATROL BUREAU IS MADE UP OF 71 SWORN POLICE OFFICERS AND PROFESSIONAL STAFF EMPLOYEES WHO ARE COMMITTED TO PROVIDING POLICE SERVICES TO THE COMMUNITY. IN ADDITION TO RESPONDING TO CALLS FOR SERVICE, OFFICERS CONDUCT PROACTIVE PATROLS TO PREVENT CRIME AND TO APPREHEND THOSE ACTIVELY INVOLVED IN CRIMINAL ACTIVITY. THE PATROL BUREAU IS STAFFED WITH SEVEN PATROL TEAMS ASSIGNED TO FOUR DAILY SHIFTS; DAY SHIFT, COVER SHIFT, SWING SHIFT, AND GRAVEYARD SHIFT. DURING THESE SHIFTS, OFFICERS ARE ASSIGNED TO THREE GEOGRAPHICAL SECTORS WITHIN THE CITY.

POLICE SERVICE OFFICERS

OUR 6 FULL-TIME AND 2 PART-TIME POLICE SERVICE OFFICERS ASSIGNED TO PATROL WERE RESPONSIBLE FOR TAKING 1,663 CRIME REPORTS AND TRAFFIC COLLISIONS, ISSUED 1,202 PARKING CITATIONS, AND HANDLED OVER 6,105 CALLS FOR SERVICE. THEY ASSISTED WITH ANOTHER 1,632 CALLS FOR SERVICE WITH CSI WORK AND EVIDENCE COLLECTION.





DETECTIVE BUREAU

THE CHINO POLICE DETECTIVE BUREAU CONDUCTS FOLLOW-UP INVESTIGATIONS WITH ALMOST EVERY CASE INITIATED FROM PATROL.

THE DETECTIVE BUREAU CONDUCTED 120 DEPLOYMENTS AND OPERATIONS TO INCLUDE SERVING 134 SEARCH WARRANTS, AND ARRESTING 118 SUSPECTS FOR A VARIETY OF CRIMES.

IN 2022, THERE WERE A TOTAL OF 1,492 CASES ASSIGNED TO THE DETECTIVE BUREAU.

TRAFFIC UNIT

The Traffic Unit consists of one Sergeant, one Corporal, five Motor Officers, one dedicated Commercial Enforcement Officer, one Traffic Officer specifically assigned to enforce commercial truck drivers driving off the truck route, one Police Service Officer, five part-time traffic Cadets, and one full-time Records Technician.

In 2022, the Traffic Unit reviewed:
1,115 traffic collision reports
5 fatal collisions
275 hit-and-run investigations
13,252 traffic citations

3,528 Administrative Truck Route citations were written department-wide.

The department made 286 DUI arrests.

The Traffic Unit held 5 OTS Grant Funded DUI checkpoints in 2022.

8,075 drivers contacted
37 suspended license citations
172 unlicensed driver citations
4 additional arrests
42 vehicles impounded





SPECIAL ENFORCEMENT TEAM

The Special Enforcement Team consists of a Sergeant, a Corporal, three Chino Police Officers, and one officer assigned to a United States Postal Service Postal Task Force. The SET team has a broad investigative scope, including gangs, narcotics, and crime trends.

In 2022, the SET team primarily focused on investigating catalytic converter thefts. In 2022, SET Investigators served eleven warrants related to catalytic converter thefts and arrested 23 people. During these operations, approximately 350 catalytic converters were recovered, and eight illegal firearms were seized.

The Quality-of-Life Team is comprised of one Sergeant, one Corporal, three Police Officers, one Probation Officer, one Department of Behavioral Health Social Worker, and two contracted SWAG case management workers. The team also partners with the City of Chino Community Services Department.

Along with their focus on homelessness and outreach, the Quality-of-Life Team also coordinates efforts to reduce reoccurring issues that affect residents, business owners, and visitors in the city. Beginning in 2023, the team will add two dedicated social workers with the recently added positions of Homeless Coordinator and Assistant Homeless Coordinator.

K9 UNIT

The Chino Police Department's Canine Unit consists of a Lieutenant, a Sergeant, and three Chino Police Canine Officers who handle three Police Service Dogs (Kobra, Cyra, and Halina).

The Canine Unit is assigned to assist and supplement the Operations Division. Each canine team supports the department operations using its heightened senses, specifically the dog's olfactory abilities and hearing abilities. Canine teams are used to locate hidden suspects, detect drugs, and locate/recover evidence for various operations. Police Service Dogs help create a safer work environment for officers when searching for suspects in concealed locations by alerting to them ahead of officers.

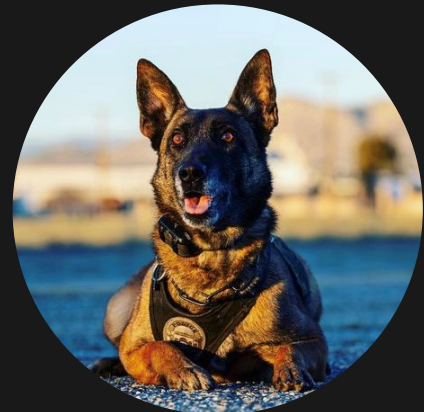

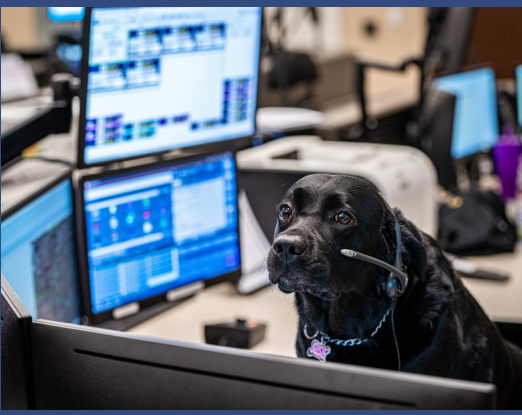
