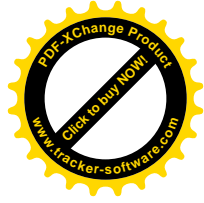
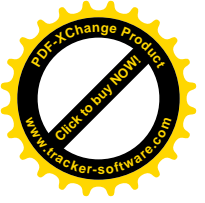
- II. Course description
 - A. Through lecture, demonstration, practical application, and testing this 4 hour course will provide the officer with the following:
 - 1. The confidence and ability to deploy the patrol rifle and engage targets from extended range above and beyond 50 yards.

- III. Course objectives: The student will be able to:
 - A. Demonstrate knowledge of rifle platform and it's abilities
 - 1. Range Capability
 - 2. Optic Capability
 - 3. Shooter Capability

 - B. Demonstrate aiming process, and rifle proficiency at various known and unknown distances.
 - 1) Accurately fire from unsupported positions.
 - 2) Use of various horizontal and vertical weapons supports
 - 3) Use of vehicle for weapons supports
 - 4) Use of buildings as a viable shooting platform

- IV. Range safety rules
 - A. Treat every weapon as if it were loaded.
 - B. Never point a firearm at anything or anybody you do not intend to shoot or in a direction where an unintentional discharge may do harm.
 - C. Never place your finger into the trigger guard or on the trigger until ready to fire (master grip).
 - D. Be sure of your target, backstop and beyond.
 - E. Obey all range commands immediately.
 - F. Never go forward of the firing line unless directed to do so.
 - G. Download your weapon into the berm or in a safe direction.
 - H. All personnel on the range shall wear eye and ear protection during shooting.

- V. Rifle Policy



- 1) Sworn members may carry off duty as permitted by the chief
- 2) Firearms must be carried in concealed manner
- 3) Holster must prevent AD and loss of control
- 4) Must be inspected by range armorer prior to being carried
- 5) Must qualify with firearm before using it off duty
- 6) Must carry badge while carrying firearm off duty
- 7) Must be secured while in their homes or vehicles
- 8) Children access to firearms= subject to criminal liability
- 9) Storage in vehicles
 - a. Locked in trunk or locked container that is out of view
 - b. Locked tool box or utility box permanently affixed to the vehicle.
- 10) Alcohol and drugs: must not be under the influence to a level that will adversely affect the members senses or judgement
- 11) Should not shoot at a moving vehicle if you can reasonable move out of the way.

VI. Drawing procedures

A. Concealed carry.

1. Lift up the front of shirt using non shooting hand
2. Place shooting hand on firearm
3. Establish a secure grip around the firearm
4. Pull up from the holster
5. Come to lower ready/on target
6. Let of your shirt with the non shooting hand
7. Establish two hand grip on the firearm

VII. Magazine Changing

A. Vary depending on condition of weapon.

1. Weapon is empty with depleted magazine (speed reload).
2. Weapon is loaded with a partially depleted magazine (tactical reload).

VIII. Speed reload

A. Slide locked to the rear.

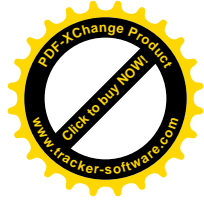
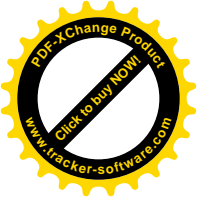
1. New magazine
2. Eject the depleted magazine and insert the fresh magazine.
3. Insert the magazine.
4. Release slide forward

IX. Tactical reload

A. New magazine.

B. Eject the partially depleted magazine into the support hand.

C. Insert the fresh magazine.



- D. Depleted magazine into pocket.

- X. Shooting from seated position
 - A. Concealed carry.

- XXV. Shooting Positions inside of vehicle
 - A. Driver seat
 - a. Out the windshield
 - b. From driver's seat using A pillar cover
 - c. Out the driver's side window
 - d. Out the passenger side window and rear window

- XI. Shooting Positions outside of vehicle
 - A. Broke back
 - B. Side prone
 - C. Kneeling
