Amended 2019-2020 Annual Action Plan CDBG-CV3

This Substantial Amendment is an addendum to 2019-2020 Annual Action Plan. The Substantial Amendment amends the existing Annual Action Plan in response to the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (CARES Act) and various waivers provided by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD).

On March 27, 2020 the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act was signed into law to respond to the growing effects of COVID-19. The CARES Act made available \$5 billion in Community Development Block Grant Coronavirus (CDBG-CV) funds. Of this amount, HUD allocated \$2 billion based on the fiscal year 2019-2020 CDBG formula and made the first round of fund allocations; the City of Chino allocations \$330,471. The second round of allocations was awarded to the states and local governments at the discretion of the HUD Secretary on a rolling basis. On September 11, 2020, the third round of funds were allocated. The City of Chino's allocation was \$457,388. The cumulative amount for all allocation rounds is \$787,859. The CDBG-CV special allocation enables communities to effectively address the impact of COVID-19 on their communities, especially low- and moderate-income individuals.

On May 19, 2020, City Council approved a substantial amendment to allocate the CDBG-CV first round funds in the amount of \$330,471 of which \$285,471 was awarded to Economic Development, Microenterprise Business Grant Program and \$45,000 was awarded to Family Service Association, FSA Senior Meals Program.

The second substantial amendment is proposing to allocate the third round of CDBG-CV3 funds to the following proposed programs:

Program Year 2019-2020	Allocation	Planned Accomplishments
Extended Camp Scholarship Program	\$42,000	Due to COVID-19 pandemic, the Chino Valley Unified School District (CVUSD) is only offering distance learning courses. The Extended Camp Scholarship program will provide support to low-income families that are seeking full-day camp for their child(ren) to participate in a safe and supervised program during distance learning courses. Approximately 10 persons will receive assistance.
Distance Learning Homework Success Program	\$45,884	Due to COVID-19, the Chino Valley Unified School District (CVUSD) has been operating a district wide Distance Learning Program since March of 2020. The City of Chino After School Programs are currently not allowed to operate at the CVUSD campuses. Prior to the pandemic, After School Programs were offered at eight elementary and at one junior high school for homework assistance. There is currently a lack of in-person homework assistance and tutoring programs. Distance Learning Homework Success Program will provide support to low-income families seeking in-person homework help for their child(ren) first through eighth grades. Approximately 65 persons will receive assistance.

<p>Senior Care Package Program</p>	<p>\$45,100</p>	<p>In accordance with statewide COVID-19 guidelines, the Chino Senior Center continues to remain closed since March 14, 2020. In order to protect the senior population and slow the spread of COVID-19 the Senior Care Package Program provides supplemental food and hygiene supplies to seniors in need of additional support for basic items such as canned goods, water, and hygiene products. Approximately 300 seniors will receive assistance.</p>
<p>Emergency Rental Assistance Program</p>	<p>\$326,404</p>	<p>Provides up to three (3) months rental assistance to Chino residents who are faced with financial hardship directly related to the COVID-19 pandemic. Program is intended to prevent homelessness and/or evictions. Approximately 80 households will receive assistance.</p>
